**III. UTD ELECTIVE REQUIREMENTS (23 Hours)**

**Advanced Electives (6 hours):**

All students are required to complete at least six hours of advanced electives outside their major field of study.  
 These must be either upper-division courses, or lower-division courses that have prerequisites.

**Free Electives (17 hours):**

Both lower-division and upper-division courses may be used as free electives, but students must complete at least 51 upper-division hours to qualify for graduation.

**A MINIMUM OF 120 SEMESTER HOURS IS REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION WITH AT LEAST 51 UPPER-DIVISION HOURS.**

**Note:** Core options listed reflect the TCCNS courses. Other courses that may potentially qualify for core requirements must be approved by an academic advisor or the department housing the student's major.
